Entry Form: Please use 1 (one) form per participant, duet or group entry. Each discipline requires a separate entry form.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. The age of the participant will be taken as of January 1st of the current festival year.
- **2.** Once a selection is entered <u>it cannot be changed</u>. An individual cannot withdraw from one class and transfer over to another class. Changes for extenuating circumstances can be brought to the Entry Secretary for consideration.
- **3.** Entries must not have been performed and adjudicated by the same participant in a previous year. Winning entries from other festivals in previous years will not be permitted.
- **4.** A performer must provide his/her own accompanist.
 - Taped or pre-recorded music will not be permitted in place of an accompanist.
- 5. The percentage system of marking will be used for the competitive classes.
 - Any complaints, protests or suggestions must be made in writing to the secretary of the festival.
- **6.** The local festival executive may alter the order of the program if necessary to accommodate unforeseen circumstances.
- 7. No participant shall rehearse at the site of the competition during festival week.
- 8. Video/audio recording or photography of your own participant's performance is permitted. VIDEO/AUDIO RECORDING OR PHOTOGRAPHY OF ADJUDICATION AND/OR OTHER PARTICIPANTS' PERFORMANCE IS <u>NOT</u> PERMITTED. NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY IS PERMITTED.
- **9.** The Executive reserves the right to present additional awards and/or split classes as needed.

10. ATTENTION ALL TEACHERS:

- -To be eligible for recommendation to provincials, participants in all solo classes must perform in two or more solo classes at the same grade/age group in the same discipline at the local festival.
- Music participants must supply the session secretary with <u>an original score</u> of the selection; <u>no photocopies will be accepted for the adjudicator or performance</u>. Legal electronic downloads must be accompanied by a receipt. Accompanists must also have <u>original scores</u>.
- All selections must be labeled with the name of the performer, title of selection, class and page number and be handed in 15 minutes prior to the session.

11. PIANO ENTRIES:

- Festival grades/levels must be the equivalent of Royal Conservatory of Music/Conservatory Canada grade level or from a list of pieces from a recognized examination syllabus.
- The **movement** of the Sonatina or Sonata must be specified.
- Popular repertoire must be performed in the Popular Piano Class. Selections from the RCM Popular Piano List should be entered in this class.
- Repeat signs shall **ONLY** be performed if required for exam purposes. This does not affect *Da capo* or *Dal Segno al Fine*, or as specifically stated otherwise.
- Students may perform in Beginner Classes for 3 consecutive years, if they are 9 & under, but only 2 consecutive years if they are 10 & over. A beginner who wins the class in their first year may enter Beginner level for the 2nd time, but if winning again must move up to Grade/Level 1.
- Students may perform competitively for 2 years in Grade 1 & Up Levels. Additional years at that same grade level may be entered as a non-competitive entry. If a student has won a class in the previous festival year they cannot enter competitively again in that class at that grade level.

12. STRING TEACHERS (Guitar, Violin, Ukulele):

- Please include years of study on the entry form.

ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARDS AND PROVINCIAL RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Award winners may compete for the same award in ensuing years, but <u>at the next</u> <u>higher grade level</u> (except Piano Grades/Levels 8 10). <u>No repetition of repertoire is allowed.</u>
- 2. A mark of at least 80% must be obtained by a performer for them to be eligible for an award.
- **3.** To enter an eligible class for Provincial Festival, a participant must meet one of the following criteria:
 - a) must reside in the Pine Creek School Division or be taught by a teacher in the division.
 - b) must be a former participant in the Gladstone Music and Arts Festival.
 - c) must not have a current festival in residing area.

FINAL DECISION WILL BE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE FESTIVAL COMMITTEE.
